## Method names

Most change ringing methods have a three part name (like Latin plant names)

- Specific - The first band to ring a method can name it. The name can be anything (places, flowers, stars, ...). Some are quite whimsical
- Type - This is to do with the way the method is constructed (and it's a bit technical)
- Stage - This is the number of bells involved - like the number of dancers in a formation dance.
