Bells have rung out over Wokingham for hundreds of years - the voice of the church speaking to the community.

They remind everyone who hears them that the church is alive.
They ring regularly to announce that worship is taking place.
They ring for weddings and sometimes for funerals.
They ring for festivals, and they mark local and national events.

Bells rung 'full circle' in the English style have a unique sound that has become part of our cultural heritage.
The two oldest bells were cast in 1703 and 1704 by Knight of Reading. In 1903, the bells were augmented from six to eight with new and recast bells by Whitechapel Bellfoundry, and hung in a new iron frame by Webb and Bennet of Kidlington.

The current project began in 1999, with four aims:
To improve the handling of the bells
To ensure they do not need major work in the foreseeable future
To improve the quality of sound
To improve the climate in the ringing room
The first phase of the project, now completed, has achieved the first three objectives. Whitechapel Bellfoundry provided four replacement bells and tuned the remainder to modern standards. Whites of Appleton provided a complete set of modern fittings and rehung the bells in the original frame. The replaced bells have all been found homes as part of restoration projects in other churches, via the agency of the Keltek Trust.
The second phase of the original project, to meet the fourth of the original objectives, will follow after the result of a wider investigation of the church heating system, and the completion of urgent repairs, including the external tower walls and the tower roof.

But now, we give thanks for what has been achieved so far, thanks for the hard work, dedication and generosity of so many people, and we rejoice in the richer, fuller, glorious sound of the restored bells sounding out over Wokingham.
